


1. Photo-Story: Sir, when and how did you start photography ?

Anil Risal Singh: It proves to be quite challenging to establish the exact moment when my interest in photography commenced. In fact, my fascination with this art form dates back to my early childhood. If I am to reminisce, I can distinctly recall instances from when I was approximately four or five years of age. On outings with my father, he would indulge in his hobby of photography, capturing moments with his camera. It was during these occasions that I acquired an affinity for this apparatus, which I would later come to identify as a camera.



As a child, I developed a keen interest in photography, which can be attributed to both my inherent passion for the art form and the fact that it was also a hobby of my father. It can be said that I have inherited this talent from my father, as it runs through my blood and is ingrained in my genes. Over the time, my interest and passion for photography have steadily grown.

When I was doing B.Sc. from Lucknow Christian College during 1972-74, under the Applied Science Association we formed a Photographic Club under the guidance of our chemistry teacher Dr. E.W. Bauer.



I was elected secretary of photographic club, we have started working darkroom where students were told how to develop films and make photo enlargements. Here my interest and involvement for photography grew to great extent.

In 1978 Luknow Camera Club was formed in Lucknow and I joined it, here I came in contact of many senior pictorial photographers, I would like to mention here that they all helped me a lot to understand the intricacies of art and science of photography specially Kr. Shukeo Singh.

Over the time my interest and passion for photography have steadily grown and it has become my obsession.

2.Photo-Story: Sir, when and how did the idea of depicting elements of design through photography came to your mind ?

Anil Risal Singh: Answering your question is tough but I'll try. Initially, like most people who practice photography, I did with various genera of photography including landscape, portrait, candid, still life, street photography, nature, wildlife, and more. However, after some time, I discovered that I had a strong interest in landscape photography, specifically in black and white. So, I began focusing on this genre.


I have been practicing landscape photography for over thirty-five However after doing years. landscape photography for such a long time, I felt a change of interest and perception in myself. 








Prof. Jaikishan Agarwal

Late Mr. Benu Sen


